Schools

Kizumanzi Primary School

- ✓ Water tanks have been supplied.
- ✓ Painting of all the classrooms has been completed.
- ✓ Help has been provided to complete the re-roofing of three classrooms.
- ✓ Equipment has been donated including posters for the classrooms and exercise books and pens for each child.
- ✓ Trees have been planted.
- ✓ Certificates have been awarded to all teachers and to the best students in each year group.
- ✓ A telephone has been provided.



Kirumbi Primary School



- ✓ Equipment has been provided including posters for the class rooms and exercise books and pens for each child.
- ✓ A telephone has been provided.
- ✓ Trees have been planted.
- ✓ Water tanks have been supplied.
- ✓ Certificates have been awarded to all teachers and to the best students in each year group.

Kileva Eastfield Primary School

- ✓ The new Kileva Eastfield school has been registered and a bank account has been opened.
- ✓ Trees have been planted around the site in Mwakoma.
- ✓ Funds donated (primarily by the Eastfield Primary School near Glasgow in Scotland) have meant that a nursery has already been built and a further classroom is nearing completion.
- ✓ Boundary fencing has been supplied and installed.



Other Schools

- ✓ Exercise Books are being provided to each child in the following schools:
 - Ghazi Primary
 - Kale Primary
 - Kajire Primary
 - Mlondo Primary
 - Wray Primary

Students

- ✓ Grants have been awarded to help pay the fees of three secondary school students that are from particularly underprivileged families.



Teachers

- ✓ Funds have been made available to pay for teachers in three separate schools where the shortage of teaching staff is particularly acute.

Plantation

- ✓ The Kileva Plantation has been established.



- ✓ So far approximately 70,000 seedlings of different tree types have been grown in the nursery thanks to the fantastic work done by the Kileva Scouts.
 - ✓ Hundreds of seedlings have been donated to various establishments (including churches and schools) throughout the region.
 - ✓ Discussions are in progress to sell seedlings to Barclays Bank and Worldvision in support of World Environment Day.
 - ✓ Following research into agro forestry techniques, the scouts have now introduced agriculture crops alongside the trees in the nursery.
- ✓ Kileva Foundation has sponsored many environmental groups (including Safina Environmental Group and Njama Forest Women's Group) to establish plantations in their villages.

Groups

Scouts

- ✓ The Kileva Rovers Scout Group has been formed and has been instrumental in establishing most of the Kileva Projects.
- ✓ Funding has been provided to equip the scouts for their project work and to train them in skills such as agro forestry and first aid.

Youth Groups

- ✓ Under a scheme from the Ministry of Youth Affairs to provide grants to unemployed groups of people to find work, Kileva Foundation has provided funding for over 110 groups to open bank accounts and to register themselves for the scheme.

Training

- ✓ A number of educational institutions have attended Field Study Events at the Kileva Foundation.
- ✓ Seminars on environment and agricultural awareness issued have been conducted.
- ✓ Talks are under way to make the Kileva Plantation the center of research for a number of governmental environmental and agricultural organisations.
- ✓ Kileva Seminars have also been conducted on drug awareness and sexually transmitted infections.



Health



- ✓ The foundation stones for a new dispensary being built by the Kileva Foundation in the Kirumbi area have been laid. This will help to counter the constant threat of things such as malaria, typhoid, cholera and snake bites.
- ✓ Grants have been provided to help in building the new dispensary at Bamako.
- ✓ Funds have also been made available for the purchase of much needed medical supplies.

Saw Mill

- ✓ A small saw mill has been established to cut wood for making furniture such as school desks, and to cater for any building work that the foundation undertakes.

Dairy Cows

- ✓ Two cows and one bull have been bought to provide milk to help fund bursaries for orphans.



Co-Operatives

- ✓ Goats have been bought to help establish a co-operative of small household businesses throughout the region.
- ✓ A Kileva poultry farm has also been built and is now rearing layers and broilers in support of the same co-operative scheme.

Water Supply

- ✓ Kileva has sponsored a team of engineers to undertake a study in the Kirumbi area into the feasibility of establishing water wells.
- ✓ Funds have been provided to help with the cost of the Macbon water project



IT & Communications

- ✓ Numerous mobile phones have been provided to improve vital communications.
- ✓ Computer equipment and accessories have been supplied.
- ✓ A small solar panel has been provided to supply power to the above.
